The ability to reach any major city in the continental U.S. in four hours or less is a significant competitive advantage. Business travelers can get to meetings and back in a day; goods and materials can reach their destinations in less than a day.

This accessibility extends internationally as well. Over 60 non-stop, direct routes take you to Japan, South Korea, China, Hong Kong, Australia, Latin and South America, Iceland, the United Kingdom and Western Europe, with connecting flights to destinations throughout Asia, Europe, Australia, Africa and South America.



SKILLED WORKFORCE

rving-Las Colinas is in the heart of one of the fastest-growing regions in the country: North Texas has gained more new residents than any other metropolitan area, adding more than 1 million people in an eight-year period.

This is good news for business, as it means a more robust, and diverse, talent pool. In fact, there are 3.3 million highly educated workers within a 30-minute commute of Irving-Las Colinas, representing 25 national origins. Irving-Las Colinas has the second-largest employment center in North Texas with an estimated 254,000 jobs, and we expect to grow that employment base by 73 percent, or 421,000 people, by 2040.

Ensuring that we continue to meet the evolving and growing needs of the business community means a concerted and continued focus on the quality and depth of secondary and higher education offered in our community.

At the college level, Irving-Las Colinas is home to the premier liberal-arts Catholic university, the University of Dallas, as well as North Lake College and DeVry University. [Add: Recent Accolade] North Lake College, part of the Dallas County Community College District, provides a full range of freshmanand sophomore-level academic credit courses, in addition to career and technical education programs that prepare students for entrance into the workforce. [Add: American College of Emergency Physicians] Innovative partnerships between Irving's business and education communities allow for better alignment between curricula and the skills needed to be successful in today's technology-based global economy. Initiatives at the college and high school levels, as well as technical training schools such as the Universal Technical Institute and Aviation Institute of Maintenance, reflect proactive efforts to train the workforce of the future for Irving businesses.

Additionally, we have three award-winning public school districts that serve the city of Irving-Las Colinas, as well as numerous prestigious charter and private schools, ensuring the employees of Irving-Las Colinas businesses have ample educational choices for their children.





A LIVABLE CITY

Food festivals and craft fairs representing all nationalities attract large crowds and reinforce the diversity [promote more] of our great city.



If you crave the outdoors, we have nearly 200 acres of parks and greenbelts, including 80 public parks and 28 miles of paved trails. On any given day, you can find people fishing, canoeing, kayaking, paddle boarding, playing with their children on one of dozens of playgrounds, taking their dogs for some play time in the dog park, or even taking in a gondola ride along the Venetian-style canals of Lake Carolyn.

Four 18-hole championship golf courses and a newly refurbished municipal course are available for the avid golfer; world-class sports tournament fields and facilities host events and competitions year-round, with eight community recreation centers and seven swimming pool facilities available for sports enthusiasts.

The newest jewel in Irving-Las Colinas is the Toyota Music Factory (TMF), home to the internationally acclaimed Pavilion at Toyota Music Factory, which hosts national and international touring musicians, comedians and prominent speakers. An outdoor, livemusic plaza and over a dozen restaurants, bars and a premier movie house make this entertainment venue a must-experience destination for residents and visitors alike. TMF along with the recently opened Westin Convention Center Hotel and the Texican Court Hotel make up the walkable entertainment district in Las Colinas.

INFRASTRUCTURE

One of Irving-Las Colinas's greatest assets is its sophisticated and expansive transportation infrastructure, which keeps people, goods and materials moving – and our local, regional and national economy thriving.

DFW International Airport is an invaluable economic driver and with part of the airport located in Irving-Las Colinas, we can guarantee access for cargo and passengers. DFW International Airport generates an estimated \$37 billion in economic impact, transporting over 69 million passengers and nearly 1 million tons of cargo annually

Daily, DFW International Airport flights reach over 250 destinations. The nearby Dallas Love Field Airport served 16 million passengers in 2018, reaching close to 60 non-stop destinations in the U.S. and Mexico and providing even greater options for discerning travelers.

Irving-Las Colinas has two commuter rail stations for the Trinity Railway Express (TRE), which connects downtown Dallas and downtown Fort Worth via Irving-Las Colinas. The Dallas Area Rapid Transit (DART) light-rail network connects Irving-Las Colinas businesses, residents and visitors directly with DFW International Airport and downtown Dallas Business District.

A network of buses and paratransit routes, along with 10 major interstate and state highways and thoroughfares enhance Irving-Las Colinas's ground game in keeping our corporate tenants and their employees moving.



AMPLE HOUSING OPTIONS

When completed, the first phase of the project will offer 40 new single-family homes along picturesque Delaware Creek and its trail system. Two more phases to the community are planned for the near future.
